SUBJ: CHARGES RE: AI-18-026

An investigation has been conducted by the Administrative Investigation Division, Professional Standards Bureau, of the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office. As a result of this investigation, the Administrative Review Board has determined you committed the following violation:

On, but not limited to, June 19, 2018, while on duty in Pinellas County, Florida, you violated the Pinellas County Sheriff's Civil Service Act Laws of Florida, 89-404 as amended by Laws of Florida 08-285, Section 6, Subsection 4, by violating the provisions of law or the rules, regulations, and operating procedures of the Office of the Sheriff.

1. You violated Pinellas County Sheriff's Office General Order 3-1.1, Rule and Regulation 5.21, Chronic Offender.

Synopsis: On May 2, 2017, while assigned to Inmate Records, you were responsible for receiving, reviewing, and acting on documentation received through criminal court records. You failed to print and act on court paperwork documenting a No-Information filed, authorizing the release of an inmate at the Pinellas County Jail. Your failure to take action resulted in an over-stay and the inmate remained in custody for an additional eleven (11) hours.

This case was investigated under AI-17-011, which resulted in Educational Based Discipline for the substantiated violation of General Order 3-1.3, Rule and Regulation 3.4(d), Performance of Duty. You received the Educational Based Discipline on June 16, 2017.

On November 30, 2017, while assigned to Inmate Records, you were responsible for receiving, reviewing, and acting on documentation affecting the custody status of Pinellas County Jail inmates. In this case, you received court action concerning an inmate and failed to properly calculate the inmate's jail sentence. Your error resulted in the erroneous release of the inmate.

This case was investigated under AI-17-047, which resulted in a Written Reprimand for the substantiated violation of General Order 3-1.3, Rule and Regulation 3.4(d), Performance of Duty. You received the Written Reprimand on March 9, 2018.

INS 18-0043

In the current case, on June 19, 2018, while assigned to Inmate Records, you were responsible for receiving, reviewing and acting on documentation affecting the custody status of Pinellas County jail inmates. You received court action concerning an inmate and failed to properly calculate the inmate's jail sentence. Your error resulted in the erroneous release of the inmate.

The aforementioned error represents a violation of General Order 3-1.3, Rule and Regulation 3.4(d), Performance of Duty.


In accordance with agency policy, this third substantiated violation of General Order 3-1.3, Rule and Regulation 3.4(d), Performance of Duty, within eighteen (18) months, classified you as a Chronic Offender, in violation of General Order 3-1.1, Rule and Regulation 5.21.

The Administrative Review Board determined you committed this violation.

Disciplinary Points and Recommended Discipline Range:

You were found to be in violation of one (1) Level Five Rules and Regulations violation totaling fifty (50) points. These points, which were affected by ten (10) carry over points from previous discipline, resulted in sixty (60) progressive discipline points. At this point level, the recommended discipline range is from seven (7) days Suspension to Termination.

Disciplinary action shall be consistent with progressive discipline, for cause in accordance with the provisions of the Pinellas County Civil Service Act.
