**CHARGES RE: AI-19-003** 

An investigation has been conducted by the Administrative Investigation Division, Professional Standards Bureau, of the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office. As a result of this investigation, the Administrative Review Board has determined you committed the following violation:

Between, but not limited to, January 15, 2019 through January 22, 2019, while on duty in Pinellas County, Florida, you violated the Pinellas County Sheriff's Civil Service Act Laws of Florida, 89-404 as amended by Laws of Florida 08-285, Section 6, Subsection 4, by violating the provisions of law or the rules, regulations, and operating procedures of the Office of the Sheriff.

1. You violated Pinellas County Sheriff's Office General Order 3-1.3, Rule and Regulation 3.4(d), Performance of Duty.

Synopsis: While assigned to Inmate Records, you were responsible for calculating time served for inmates entering the Pinellas County Jail with previously imposed sentences. If it is confirmed an inmate served a portion of their previously imposed sentence, this would impact the release date concerning the custody status of a Pinellas County Jail inmate.

In this case, you admitted you failed to take into consideration the time an inmate previously served related to the same charge. As a result, you failed to properly release the charge on the correct date and the inmate remained in custody.

Your failure to confirm and calculate the time served for the previously imposed sentence, per proper procedure, resulted in an over-stay and the inmate remained in custody for an additional seven (7) days.

The Administrative Review Board determined you committed this violation.

## Disciplinary Points and Recommended Discipline Range:

You were found to have violated one (1) Level Three Rule/Regulation totaling fifteen (15) points. These points, which were affected by no modified points from previous discipline, resulted in fifteen (15) progressive discipline points. At this point level, the recommended discipline ranges from a Reprimand to three (3) days Suspension.

Disciplinary action shall be consistent with progressive discipline, for cause in accordance with the provisions of the Pinellas County Civil Service Act.
